

SYNOPSIS

A wealthy pig-breeder, Kalman Zsupan, who is also Mayor of Zrinuyi, Hungary, rears his pigs on the estate of Sandor Barinkay. The estate is the site of a large gipsy encampment and who regard Sandor Barinkay as a friend and his exiled father as a "Gipsy Baron." The Gipsies, arrive with their Queen, Czipra, to inform the Mayor how their Queen has dreamed that exiled Sandor will return to occupy the Barinkay estate. The Queen's dream is fulfilled and Sandor Barinkay returns to a rousing welcome from the villagers.

Count Kareska, a Civil Commissioner, who has accompanied Sandor, confides to Zsupan that a vast treasure is hidden in the Barinkay Castle. Sandor is unaware of this and both Kareska and Zsupan plot to share the treasure. Arletta, Zsupan's ambitious daughter, is encouraged by her father to seek a proposal of marriage from Sandor, but the latter turns her down to the delight of Otto, who loves her himself.

The Gipsies support Sandor and acclaim him their "Gipsy Baron." He and Saffi, the grand-daughter of Czipra, fall in love and a Gipsy marriage is arranged.

Kareska virtually threatens Barinkay with exile for associating with Gipsies but this does not materialise when Czipra disclosed that Saffi is the daughter of The Turkish Pasha, who before his death left his wealth in her care. Amidst great rejoicing, Czipra bestows such a wealth to Sandor and Saffi.

However, such joy is short-lived, as Graf Homonoy, Governor of the Province, arrives on a recruiting campaign for the Turks have invaded Hungary. Sandor, and his gipsy followers enrol and form a troop of Hussars. Zsupan, and Otto, are foxed into enlisting. Homonoy makes Kareska responsible for the custody of the treasure and welfare of Czipra and Saffi.

The Turks are defeated. In Vienna preparations are made for the return of the victorious army, including the Hussars. In the palace Czipra and Saffi place themselves under the protection of Homonoy to save Saffi from the unwelcome attentions of Kareska, who is virtually banished and sent into retirement.

Sandor returns and is regarded as a hero. He is duly created a real Baron, and the treasure restored to him. He is reunited with Saffi and both look forward to a happy life together.

Arletta finds solace in the arms of faithful Otto, and Zsupan succumbs to a proposal of marriage from his housekeeper, Mirabella.


