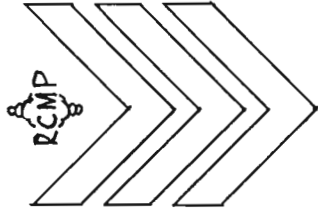

THE STORY

The play opens in Lady Jane's Hotel in Saskatchewan. Lady Jane herself is wooed both by Sergeant Malone of the Mounted Police, and Hard-Boiled Herman, a bold, bad, desperate product of the gold diggings.

Wild Jim Kenyon, an associate of Herman's at the goldfields, is really in love with the fascinating Rose Marie, whose brother Emile wishes her to marry his rich, scheming employer, Edward Hawley.

Hawley is temporarily attracted by Wanda, the ardent, half-caste wife of an Indian, Black Eagle.

Supposing her husband to be out, Wanda invites Hawley to her cabin, where they are surprised by Black Eagle. In the uproar, Black Eagle is stabbed to death by Wanda, who puts the blame on Jim Kenyon. Thus Jim becomes a fugitive, hiding in a castle in the mountains.

Rose Marie is heartbroken, but to protect her lover from the "Mounties" promises to marry Hawley, who knows of Jim's whereabouts.

Plans for the wedding are going ahead when Jim returns, having found Wanda, who admits that she killed Black Eagle.

Naturally, Jim Kenyon now takes the place of the discomfited Hawley, and everything ends happily.

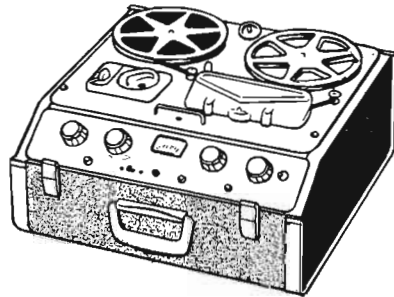

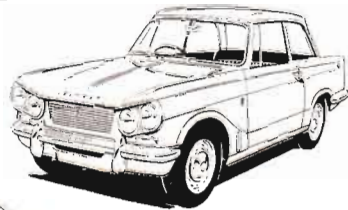

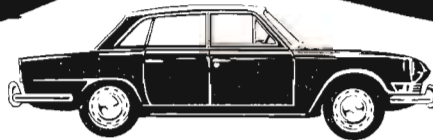

Members also have the right to be present at, and vote at, Annual General Meetings of the Company, which are generally held each year in April. At these meetings the production policy for the ensuing year is usually shaped. The annual subscription for Associate Membership is £1.

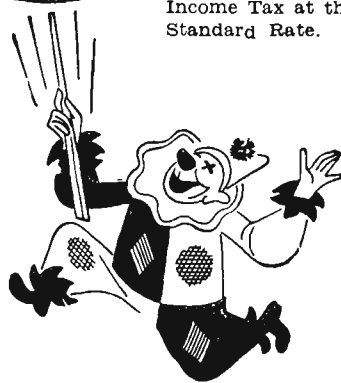
