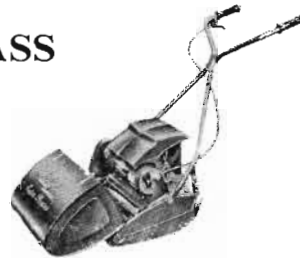

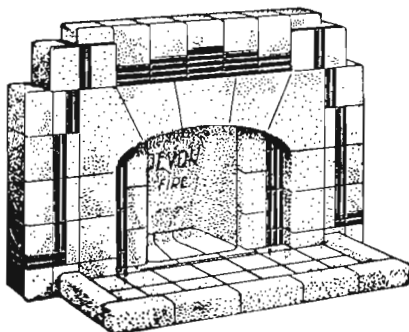

The Story



It is on record that Anton Dvorak, the great Czech composer, weary of conducting concerts and teaching music at the National Conservatory in New York, spent some weeks of Summer, 1893, in a settlement of Bohemian lumbermen in the Middle West; and that he was at the time exasperated by his own inability to complete the "American" symphony which his admirers expected of him. Dvorak was a lover of Nature and the simple life, one of his principal hobbies being a passionate interest in steamships and railway trains. From that Summer of 1893 emerged one of his greatest and best-beloved compositions, the Symphony in E minor ("From the New World"). We would not pretend that the characters of *Summer Song* ever existed or that the events in "Willow Falls" actually took place. Our play is no more than a musical fairy-tale, although it is certain that its hero's inspiration for the "New World" Symphony came from his belated discovery that the real America did not consist entirely of hotel rooms, Pullman cars and concert halls.

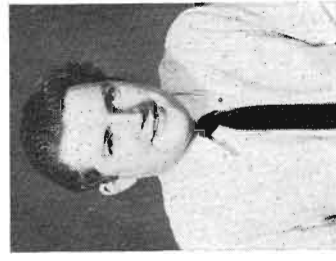

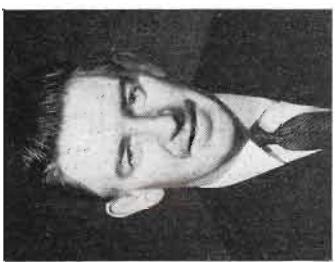

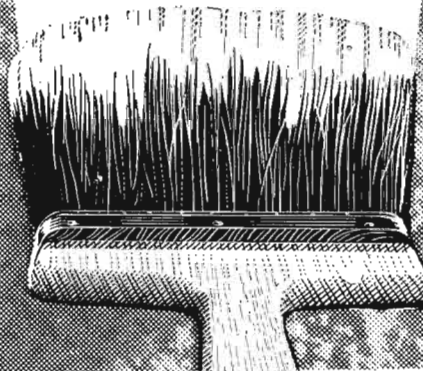

Members also have the right to be present and vote at Annual General Meetings of the Company, which are generally held each year in April. At these meetings the production policy for the ensuing year is usually shaped. The current Annual Subscription for Associate Membership is 25/-.

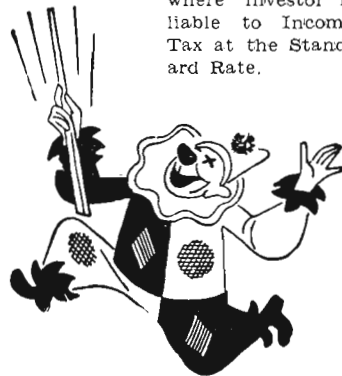
