



Hon. President's Remarks

Welcome to our first show in Eden Court Theatre. For the first time in many years we do not have to worry whether or not you are sitting comfortably. It was reassuring to the committee to find the playing members almost doubled at the start of rehearsals and we are delighted to have so many new people in our cast. Finance has been a worry after one or two lean years, but box office receipts for the *Mikado* have been encouraging and we thank you for your support. We have made our own scenery again this year but the costumes by and large have been hired from our neighbours the Nairn and Strathpeffer Opera Companies. The success of this year's show will perhaps allow for more lavish productions in the future.

This is the Company's Golden Jubilee year and fifty years ago the show presented by the Company was also the *Mikado*. Special celebrations for our Golden Jubilee were felt to be beyond our resources but nevertheless the Company feels very proud of its long history and tradition of providing not only a very satisfying outlet for the musical and acting talents in Inverness but also entertaining shows for the public.

A new Patron's scheme has been introduced this year. It replaced the old Associate Membership scheme where two free seats were allowed for the annual subscription. Patrons are now asked to contribute £1 each and form a supporters club in return for priority booking rights only. The response to our new type of scheme has been very good as you will see from the list of Patrons appearing in the programme. We are always eager to have new Patrons and if you and your friends wish to have a closer link with the Company we invite you to apply for membership to our Hon. Secretary or to the Patrons' Secretary.

And now I am sure that you want to do nothing more than to sit back and enjoy the show. Gilbert and Sullivan is a great personal favourite of mine and I am pleased that the Company has been able to show its versatility by turning its talents to the D'Oyly Carte operattas once again after several years of successful more modern musicals.





Red Wedding is the somewhat unfortunate English title of Chabrol's Les Noces Rouges, which first appeared at a time when its director's output was approaching three films a year. Because of this, perhaps, it was not as well received by the critics as some of his earlier work; to some extent, it departs from the usual Chabrol pattern by having a foursome rather than a triangle as its dramatic centre - Piccoli is having an affair with Audran and together they plan to dispose of their respective spouses. The result is less a psychological study of a couple under the pressure not only of their own emotions but also of the stifling social atmosphere of a provincial French town.
