The Story

In the Southern State of Louisiana in the year 1792, a wealthy planter, Beaunoir, employs many sailors and bond servants. Among the latter is Robert Misson, an aristocrat who has ideas of liberty and equality not welcomed at the court of France. He has escaped to America to avoid arrest for treason.

Ribaud, a French detective in pursuit of Robert, arrives at Beaunoir's estate. He finds Robert, who has fallen in love with Marianne, the daughter of the house, and immediately plans to arrest him. Meanwhile, at the Cafe Creole, Robert's friend Philippe calls a gathering of revolutionaries, which Robert attends. Despite Philippe's protests Robert returns to Beaunoir's house to say goodbye to Marianne, but Ribaud apprehends him, taking him to Beaunoir's ship "New Moon". Marianne, in order to be with him promises to marry the Captain of the ship, and Ribaud consents to her going.

Philippe, knowing that Robert is on the "New Moon", sets sail to rescue him, which he succeeds in doing. The revolutionaries elect Robert their chief and set sail for the Isle of Pines to start a world of liberty, brotherhood and equality.

The colony is established. Ribaud, resident against his will, by scheming turns the islanders against their chief and they are ready to leave him just as matters become crucial. An Admiral from two newly arrived French ships takes over the colony. He informs them that France is a Republic. He re-establishes the colony and appoints Robert as governor of the island.

Producer's Note

The Operetta is a typical product of the 1930s, the time when it was compiled; as such, it has taken its place among all the escapist, fantasy productions of the Theatre and Cinema that arose out of the awful years of the American Depression. It gave contemporary audiences a chance to "get away" from the bleak conditions that most of them found themselves in.

The historical "frame" in which the story is set hangs very loosely, and makes no attempt at accuracy to present an audience with a serious picture of the year 1792, or offer comment on events that led to the French Revolution. But instead the musical puts forward an adventurous, and pseudo glamorous reflection of the thoughts and attitudes of the thirties. It is in this context that I hope present audiences will view this production, and receive as much fun, enjoyment, and pleasure as we have had in presenting it.

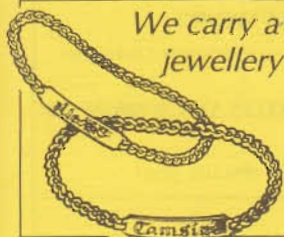

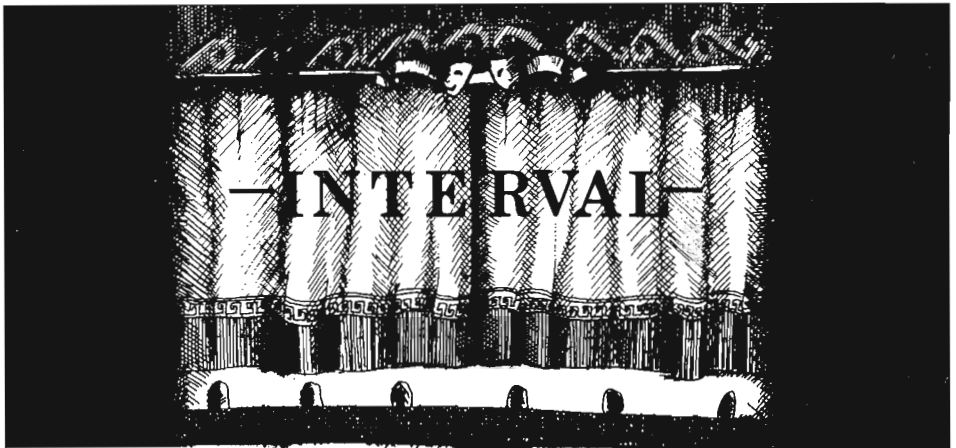

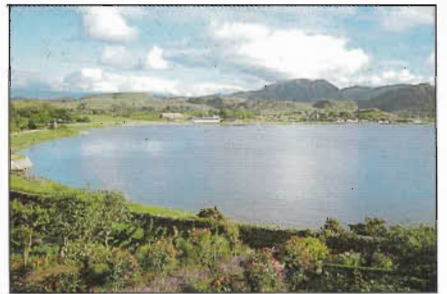
