

Programme Notes

Merrie England — Music by **Edward German** Lyrics by **Basil Dean**

First produced in 1902 and an instant success, this famous operetta is compiled of a host of historical and fictitious characters set against the rich pageant of Tudor England. The partnership of German & Dean was hailed as the natural successor to Gilbert & Sullivan. The witty libretto and excellent music contribute to an extremely enjoyable and colourful entertainment.

The Plot

The story is contained within the historic period of the reign of Queen Elizabeth I. The Earl of Essex causes Sir Walter Raleigh to lose favour with the Queen by revealing Raleigh's love for her lady in waiting, Bessie Throckmorton. Elizabeth has Bessie imprisoned and Raleigh banished, but Essex later undergoes a change of heart and works to end the estrangement between the lovers and the Queen, which he brings about using a simple plan of deception.

These events take place amid the jollity of May Day revels, which Elizabeth and her court attend, on the banks of the River Thames.
