





## The Story of 'OKLAHOMA'

This is a story of the simple pioneering folk of Oklahoma about 90 years ago. We meet Aunt Eller, one of the sturdy women of that period who, with the aid of Jud Fry, a hired hand, runs the homestead of her niece Laurey, a young girl of considerable charm. Curly McClain, a young cowboy who is in love with Laurey comes "a-callin'" but he has a rival in Jud whose passion for Laurey makes him not too particular in his methods of claiming her favours.

Will Parker, a lovesick cowboy, is also pressing his suit with Andrew Carne's daughter, Ado Annie, a flighty dumb blonde who "cain't say no" when the men are around. This leads to many complications when Will finds she has taken up with Ali Hakim — the Persian pedlar man. Laurey, piqued by Curly's bragging, very reluctantly agrees to accompany Jud to the Box Social though she would rather go with Curly but is too scared of Jud to tell him she has changed her mind. When Curly hears this he calls on Jud in his miserable Smokehouse, and there is a scene of drama, comedy and song.

Laurey believes she can find the answer to her troubles through the medium of the elixir which Ali Hakim has sold her saying "one whiff of this and you'll see everying clear." She opens the bottle and takes a deep breath and as she floats away on her dream the Ballet begins. This depicts Laurey being married to Curly but turns to a nightmare with the appearance of Jud Fry and her dream gives her an awful premonition for the future.

At the Box Social the party is in full swing and Aunt Eller quickly brings order so that the auction, at which the cowboys bid for the hampers of their respective girl friends, can begin. Curly bids all his worldly goods against Jud to win Laurey's hamper and so increases Jud's hatred of him. Aunt Eller, however, is a match for any situation and breaks up the tense moment by getting Curly to dance with her, which unfortunately gives Jud the opportunity to claim Laurey as his partner. Jud dances Laurey to a quiet spot and now tries to embrace her which causes an upsurge of temper, she suddenly loses her fear of him and orders him off the premises for good. When Curly appears she is so relieved that when he diffidently proposes she immediately falls into his arms.

Ali Hakim sets out on his travels, but before going he says his final farewell to Ado Annie much to Will's relief. Later at the wedding festivities of Laurey and Curly, much to everyone's surprise Ali Hakim returns, married at the point of her father's gun to Gertie Cummings, a girl with a laugh that will madden him to the end of his days. The fun is at its height when Jud arrives and tries to kiss the bride; Curly pulls him away and there is a fight, during which Jud is killed by falling on his own dagger.

All is then cleared up for the departure of Laurey and Curly on their honeymoon.

OKLAHOMA was first produced by The Theatre Guild on April 1st, 1943, at the St. James Theatre, New York City, and in London it was first produced at The Theatre Royal, Drury Lane, on April 30th, 1947.

This is the third time Inverness Opera Company has presented 'Oklahoma.' The first production was staged in the Empire Theatre in January 1961. It was next presented in Inverness High School Hall in April 1974.


